

PEEL LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT SCHOOL

Term 2 has started very well for most students. The learning programs are in full swing, and the Teachers are beginning their preparations for reporting at the end of the Semester. The weather has been very kind to us as well with lovely sunshine most of the time. Some rain would be nice for the gardens and to keep things growing in the environment. The Noongar season of Djeran is symbolised by the colour green. Djeran is when the land is cooling in preparation for the arrival of the next Noongar season of Makura. Noongar people are the traditional Aboriginal people from the Southwest of Western Australia and Noongar country 'Boodja' covers an area from Jurien Bay through to Esperance.

We were successful in receiving a \$1000.00 Woolworths Landcare Grant for the RLPS Campus site. We, together with the team at Rockingham Lakes, will be using this grant to reimagine the grass area between Block 1 and the Peel Resource Room. We are planning to turn this into a Yarning Circle space with an edible native garden. Plans are underway to begin work in a few weeks.

On May 18th we held two Open Sessions for parents and allied professionals to gain more information about our school and our referral process. We held one session at our Mandurah PS Campus and the other at the Rockingham Lakes Campus. We had three families and one professional attend our Mandurah session and 20 families attended the RLPS event. Families left with the information they needed and the knowledge that should they need support to get their application in for 2024 we are only a phone call or email away. We followed those sessions with a meeting of our team and the South Metro CDS senior staff to confirm we have all our pathways and processes in place to ensure good communication between Education and Health. These meetings are always valuable to touch base with the latest information and messaging from Health Services and likewise for us to give the latest information from Education to Health.
