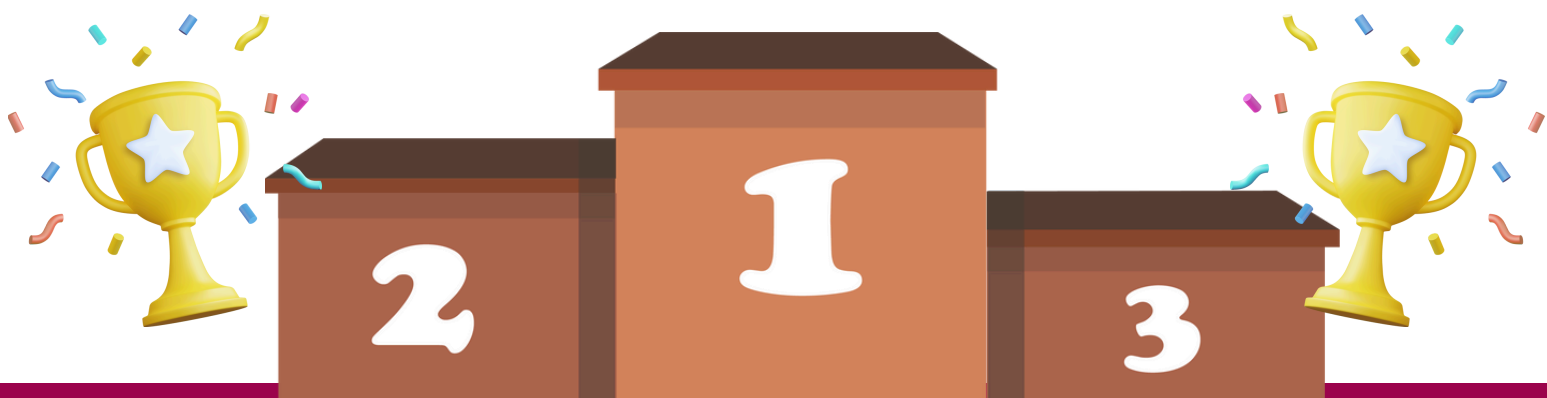
SPORTS CARNIVAL EXTRAVAGANZA: A DAY OF TEAM SPIRIT AND FUN

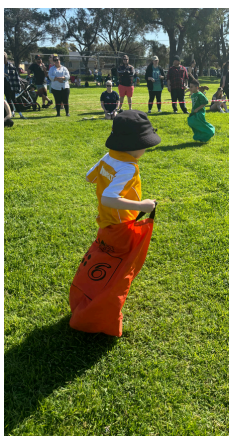

ROOM 5 BOOM, CLAP, GRAB

In Room 5 we have been working really hard to identify the middle vowel sound in words. Our favourite class game this term has been "Boom, Clap, Grab". For this game the students work in partners and have to listen carefully to their teacher's instructions. When the teacher says "boom" the students tap their knees, when the teacher says "clap" the students clap their hands. Next comes the tricky part, the teacher will say a CVC word and the students must work in their team to find the correct letter sound and hold it up as quick as they can. The students blow us away every time we play this game with their patience, teamwork, ability to follow instructions and letter sound knowledge. What superstars!



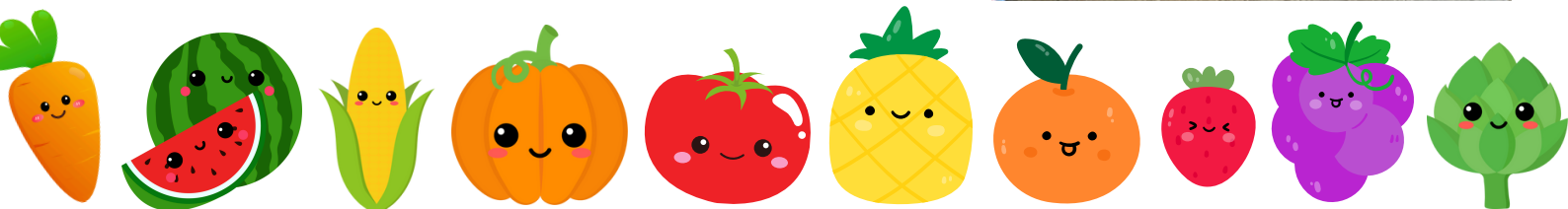

Jackson B – “I liked cooking because we could eat other people’s food.”

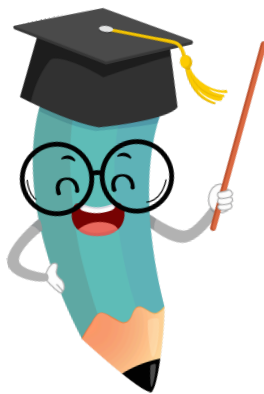
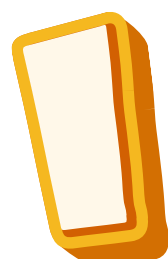
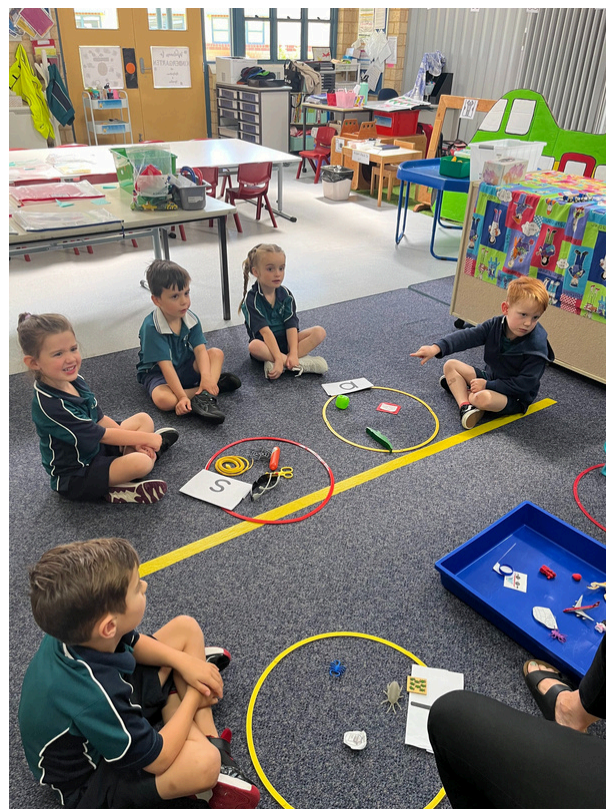
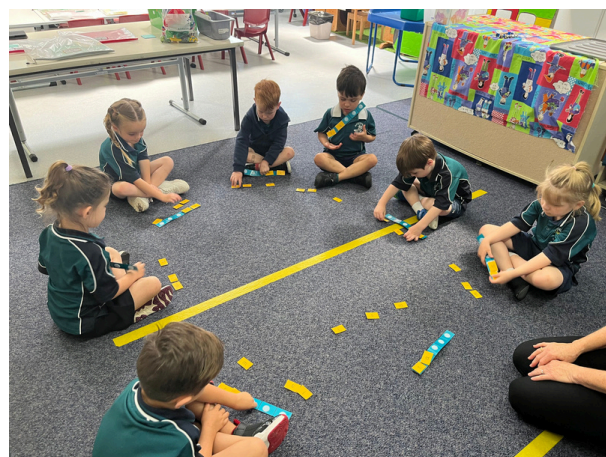
Aliyah – “That we know how to use sharp knives carefully and know some tricks we can use for leftover food.”

They are doing an amazing job of listening and following instructions on the mat while we locate and categorize toys that begin with these sounds. We are also learning to write these letters using the Peggy Leggo which is another whole school program.

After reading and studying the book, we enjoyed thinking about the meaning and what the characters might have been feeling and thinking. We put these into thought bubbles. Some examples where:

"You smell yummy, I will gobble you up. Get on my nose"
(The Fox to the Gingerbread Man).

"Don't get me because I don't smell yummy!", "I'll run, run, as fast as I can"
(The Gingerbread Man to the characters chasing him).

"I am hungry, I will make a yummy gingerbread man" (The old lady).



We had a lot of fun making puppets to act out the story before writing our own story retells. Class 1.4 are very proud to have rewritten a whole story. And of course, everyone wanted to make their own gingerbread man to take home, complete with a handwritten recipe book.

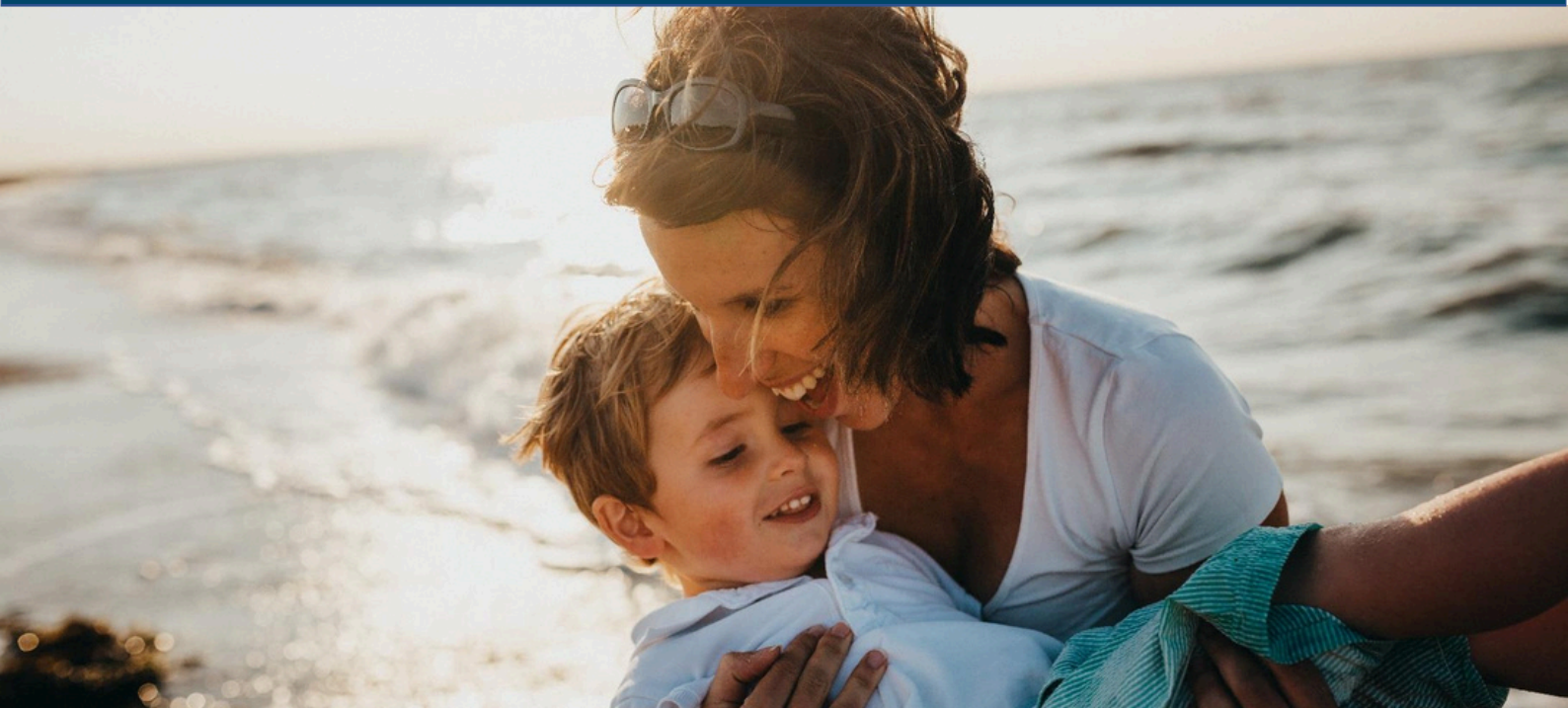
